- Share anything you would like about growing up.
  - o Did you move often or stay in the same place?
  - Where did you go to school? What were your favorite subjects? Any favorite teachers?
  - Did you participate in any activities, sports or hobbies? Do you still enjoy them today?
  - o What was popular? What did you think about it?
- What was your favorite job (paid and/or volunteer) and why?
- What has changed in your lifetime?
- Can you share a valuable lesson that changed your life?
- What else would you like to add?
- ❖ Ask or share any other things that you think of during your conversation.
- ❖ Thank the interviewee (Mom) and keep your information safe. You may wish to create a journal, family history book or file to preserve this information.
