## Make a May Day Paper Cone

## Supplies

- Hole Punch
- Paper for cone any paper will do
- Paper for card
- Pen or marker for writing your message
- Ribbon, string, yarn, twine, chenille stems
- Scissors
- Tape
- Tokens flowers, lightweight candy, small light gift

## Directions

- Roll paper into a cone shape
- Tape to secure shape
- Trim paper if needed
- Use holepuch to make holes at the top of your cone on either side of the cone to attach a ribbon or string
- Cut a shape out of the paper for writing your message
- o Write a message on your paper cut out
- o Tape your message to the cone
- $\circ \;\;$  Cut a piece of ribbon, string, yarn, twine or use a chenille stem for a hangar
- Put one end of your ribbon, string, yarn, twine or chenille stem through each hole at the top of your cone
- o Secure your hangar with a knot, bow, or twist
- Fill your cone
- o Give your May Day gift to someone
